Dear St. Peter's Church Family,

This is my final 'View from River Street.' I write to express my appreciation and thanksgiving for this parish and the nearly thirteen years of service. I write to encourage you to hope for a future that none of us can see right now. I write to say again – from both Terry and I, how sorry we are for the wounds that our family has brought to St. Peter's. I write to say how important it has been to us to have your support (just how incredible it has

been) in this past year when so much was going wrong in our family.

I appreciate and give thanks for the privilege of serving you in St. Peter's, and participating in the community of Milford since I began here November 1, 1999. I can cast my mind back to so many wonderful occasions of celebration – Easter services – Christmas services – Mission Trips – Alpha programs – and the many baptisms and confirmations, weddings, and funerals. It has been a busy time of ministry and of knowing God at work in our midst. It has been a time of great change, challenge, and complexity. We have grown together – how that was borne witness to when we celebrated my ministry two weeks ago at Aldario's. I can only hope and pray that God will continue to sift the wheat from the chaff of my ministry among you, and that the fruit will abide – while the chaff will be consumed by the fires of God's forgiveness and mercy.

It is a time of goodbyes and of transition, happening in a chaotic and traumatic manner, mostly out of our control. This simply adds to the emotional difficulty of the time we are in, and the challenge to sustain faith in the midst of it all. We don't know what the future holds or who even holds our future. In such a time there is little to be said in the way of consolation – it is a time to sit with one another and just be. Yet it is a time to be reminded of the foundations – as you did me two weeks ago – and this is what I have sought to do in my final Sundays: Christian Foundations -Life and Death pointing from our brokenness to the Abundant Life that is God's gift. The Resurrection of Jesus, anchoring us in Hope. God's Power to live that abundant life: not just spiritual gifts and fruits – but real human power that undergirds us through the height and depth and breadth and width of human experience. Finally – the purpose of Mission – "As the father sent me so I send you." John 20:21. We are given life and hope and power for a purpose: to bring all humanity to share in these gifts and graces of God's love.

As our ways diverge, and we continue our journey apart, may we never lose the foundation, or the path on which Jesus Christ is the one we follow. Thank you for all of your love, encouragement, support, and faithful ministry these 13 years.

Dear friends in Christ,

It was a delight to see so many of you again this past Sunday. Nina and I felt right at home with you and were glad to have had a free Sunday to be able to worship together at St. Peter's. This is a hard time for everyone, with many unknowns and questions still swirling about. But, in the midst of the uncertainties and difficulties any of us are facing, the words of a hymn that first appeared in a 1787 hymnal in England are a wonderful encouragement to me and I trust they will be to you as well. In fact, when I recently asked my 90 year old father what his favorite hymns were, this was the first one he mentioned!

And, I just read that this was the favorite hymn of Robert E. Lee, Andrew Jackson, and Theodore Roosevelt! We're in good company with the saints who have gone before us as we think about these powerful words for our own lives, whatever the circumstances.

HOW FIRM A FOUNDATION (Hymnal 636,637; same text, different tunes)

How firm a foundation, ye saints of the Lord,
Is laid for your faith in His excellent word!
What more can He say than to you He hath said—
To you that for refuge to Jesus have fled?

“Fear not, I am with thee, oh, be not dismayed,
For I am thy God, and will still give thee aid;
I'll strengthen thee, help thee, and cause thee to stand
Upheld by My righteous, omnipotent hand.

“When through the deep waters I call thee to go,
The rivers of woe shall not thee overflow;
For I will be with thee, thy troubles to bless,
And sanctify to thee thy deepest distress.

“When through fiery trials thy pathway shall lie,
My grace, all-sufficient, shall be thy supply;
The flame shall not hurt thee; I only design
Thy dross to consume, and thy gold to refine.

“The soul that to Jesus hath fled for repose,

That soul, though all hell should endeavor to shake,
I'll never, no never, no never forsake.”

FORWARD – DAY BY DAY Thursday, July 5

Psalm 132. *Let us go to God's dwelling place; let us fall upon our knees before his footstool.*

A little girl in our congregation heard that our rector would be leaving us for another post. When Sunday came she said to her parents, “Why are we going to church if God won’t be there?” Mom and Dad were suddenly aware that had a misunderstanding to handle.

In the psalm, King David is search for a place to set down the Ark of the Covenant, the symbol of the presence of God. The people had carried the Ark with them from place to place, but now they wanted to honor God with a permanent house. Finally, the Ark was carried to Jerusalem and the Temple was built to accommodate it.

The Hebrews eventually realized, if they had not known it before, that God is not limited to a permanent house but can be met everywhere. The little girl liked the man who smiled at her and called her by name, and she equated him with god. We hope that as she grew she learned that being in the presence of God is not limited to a certain person or place.

God is here. Wherever we “fall upon our knees” before God is where God is. WE may be sure of that.
