Observing a Holy Lent Epistle March 2014

Lent is a season of intentional discipline and devotion. It begins with Ash Wednesday, a traditional day of fasting when we receive the imposition of ashes as a reminder of our mortality and the need to repent of our sins. We humble ourselves before the Lord remembering how great our God is and how short we fall of

his perfection; this is not a season of self-flagellation or torturing ourselves for the sake of asceticism! Jesus has already died on the cross for our sins. He has paid the price for us. The disciplines of Lent are intended to lead us to a holier lifestyle - one that is set apart for God's purposes and better serves him. Just as a doctor will tell you the healthiest way to lose weight is to change your eating habits rather than go on an extreme temporary diet that we could never keep up for long; so is a Lenten discipline best observed as putting in place healthier spiritual habits that you would like to do always but will be particularly intentional about during Lent. You might take on a devotional time each day during Lent with the hope of making this a regular life habit to help you walk more closely with the Lord. You might give up sweets or alcohol as a reminder of all that Jesus suffered for us and with the intention of developing healthier habits in the long run. The idea of giving something up only to start binging on Easter defeats the purpose. Just as we might fast for spiritual reasons to have all our energy focused in prayer (rather than digesting food) and to give us a spiritual clarity; and we fast for health reasons to clear our body of toxins to get back on a healthier track; the fasting and disciplines of Lent are intended to put us on a healthier, holier track in body, mind, and spirit for our good and for God's glory. So prayerfully seek God's leading in the disciplines you take on or give up during Lent that you would be walking into his will for you. Perhaps ask if he is leading you to become a part of a certain ministry as well. Think of it as putting yourself on the Potter's wheel and into his hands that he might fashion you into the vessel he created you to be.

Caring for your Children

St. Peter's is pleased to provide for the care of your infants and children through age 3 by a well-qualified certified adult caregiver and an assistant in the nursery on the second floor of the education building during the 10:00 a.m. service. 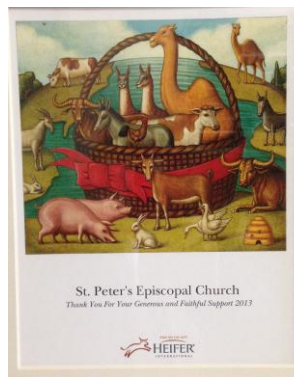

It's Time to Redefine Failure

“Fear of man will prove to be a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is kept safe.”
Proverbs 29:25 (NIV)

Satan’s favorite tool to diminish your faith is the fear of failure. But you cannot serve God and be constantly worried about what other people think. You have to move forward. Proverbs 29:25 says, *“Fear of man will prove to be a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is kept safe.”* (NIV)

So how do you get rid of the fear of failure?

One way is to redefine failure. What is failure? Failure is not failing to reach your goal. Failure is not having a goal. Failure is not failing to hit your target. Failure is not having a target. Failure is not falling down. Failure is refusing to get back up. You’re never a failure until you quit. So if you’re attempting something for the glory of God, that’s a good thing. Failure is not trying and not accomplishing anything. Failure is failing to try.

Another way to get rid of the fear of failure is to never compare yourself to anybody else. You’re always going to find somebody who’s doing a better job, and you get discouraged. And, you’re always going to find somebody who’s not doing as good a job as you are, and you become full of pride. Both of them will mess up your life. Discouragement and pride will keep you from serving God’s purpose for your life.

The Bible says in Galatians 6:4, *“Each of you must examine your own actions. Then you can be proud of your own accomplishments without comparing yourself to others.”* (GW)

Did you notice that the Bible says there is a legitimate pride? There’s a good kind of pride and there’s a bad kind of pride. The bad kind of pride is comparing: “I’m better than so and so!” The good kind of pride is, “God, I’m proud of what you’re doing in my family, my business, my life, my walk of faith.” That’s the good kind of pride.

God hasn’t called me to be the best pastor in the world. God has called me to be the best pastor I can possibly be given the gifts, talents, and experiences he gave me. When you get to Heaven, God isn’t going to say, “Why weren’t you more like so and so?” He’s going to say, “Why weren’t you who I made you to be?”

Let go of your fear of failure, because anything you’re attempting for God in faith is a good thing, regardless of the results.

Talk It Over

- How has your fear of what other people think kept you from moving forward in faith?
- In what ways are you using your gifts and abilities to work toward your goals?
- What failures have kept you from pursuing your goals and dreams? What do you think God wants you to learn from those setbacks?

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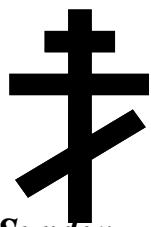
