Junior Warden's Report

As most of you know, St. Peter's is preparing for some major renovations including repointing the exterior brownstone, installing new stained glass window covers, and painting the interior of the church. All of these renovations present challenges like finding contactors who will do the work for a reasonable price, scheduling when the work will be done, and finding ways to fund the projects.

The brownstone work is the largest job that needs to be done. We have obtained rough estimates and have had several contractors look at the condition of the building. Although there are many areas that need repointing (repointing is the process of removing deteriorated mortar from the joints between the brownstone and replacing it with new matching mortar) the area that needs the most attention is the

top ten feet of the tower over the narthex and the entire steeple. Over the next few months we will continue to work with contractors to obtain more quotes. Although this work needs to be done, it has been decided to put it off until next spring or summer due to funding issues and the upcoming 250th celebration.

As I reported last month, Tyler Lewis and Rich Hebert are planning to polish the stained glass window coverings as a stop gap solution to replacing them. The plan is to get this done in June or July. The option to purchase new window covers is still on St. Peter's Wish List for those who wish to purchase a new cover. Donations may be made by writing stained glass cover on your check or offering envelope.

That leaves painting the interior of the church. The quotes that we have received thus far are very high. The lowest was nearly 80 thousand dollars but included painting the ceiling which we will not be doing. We are currently waiting for revised quotes, but I am not confident that those numbers will be workable, so we have devised a plan to do the work ourselves if the new quotes are too high. I would like to compile a list of parishioners with plaster repair and painting skills in the event we end up doing the painting ourselves. It is clear that the biggest hurdle we need to conquer is funding these projects, but I believe that our faith in the Lord will carry us over whatever is thrown into our path.

God's Family is the Church

"You will all be joined together, and you will give glory to God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Christ accepted you, so you should accept each other, which will bring glory to God." (Romans 15:6-7 NCV)

There are only two ways to get into a family: You can either be born into it, or you can be adopted into it. God does both for you! It's called being born again, and it's called being adopted into the family of God. God does both.

In Roman law, during New Testament times, you could disown a child you birthed. But if you adopted a child, you were forbidden to ever disown that child. God says you are not only born again into his family, but he has adopted you, and there is no way he could ever disown you. That's good news!

You may ask, "No matter what I do? Really?" No matter what you do!

Once you're born, you cannot be unborn. Once you are born again, you cannot be unborn again. You can grieve the Father, just like we sometimes bring grief to our earthly parents. The fellowship may be broken, but no matter what your parents say, everybody knows you are still their child. In the same way, once you become a child in the family of God, you're in!

The Bible says in 1 Timothy 3:15, "I want you to know how people who are members of God's family must live. God's family is the church" (GW). This means church is not something you go to. Church is something you belong to. We are the family of God.

Many people think that Christianity is a belief system, but it is a *belong* system. Yes, there are beliefs involved, but it's more than that. It means you are a part of the body of Christ.

You belong to the family of God: "You will all be joined together, and you will give glory to God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Christ accepted you, so you should accept each other, which will bring glory to God" (Romans 15:6-7 NCV).
