Going Deeper With Jesus

Earlier this summer I spent two weeks serving a church in the Caribbean as a sort of working vacation. Island life is a much slower pace and the parishioners there are accustomed to a more contemplative form of spirituality. It was a wonderful time of restoration for me and an opportunity to think about developing that side of things at St Peter's. It's easy to get caught up in our busy lives that we don't leave

time for quiet meditation or the study and prayer needed to develop our spiritual lives. It's the old "the squeaky wheel gets the oil". We don't realize what we have neglected until we find ourselves trying to draw from an empty well, unable to have prayer be effective for us, feeling overwhelmed by life, or bottoming out emotionally. Like anything else worth doing, our spiritual lives need to be developed to be effective for us. To really have that time of listening to the Lord we need to be disciplined about building it in to our schedules and our lifestyles. Coming to church regularly and having your own additional devotional time develops that spiritual strength and fills your spiritual well so you are prepared when the challenges come. It is an important part of keeping that sense of peace within regardless of how much things seem to be in a whirlwind around us. I also find that this closer walk with the Lord makes life all the more exciting (in a good way) because I am able to see the way the Lord is bringing blessings and answered prayer as a result of that time listening to His direction.

This summer I have spent some time exploring different options for opportunities to do this in small group studies here at St. Peter's during the program year. I am hoping these resources will be fruitful tools to help all of us grow in our Christian journeys this fall. We will be offering a variety of opportunities for study and prayer, some of which are explained in more detail inside this newsletter. Others will be further outlined closer to September. It is my hope that we will continue to go deeper in our relationship with the Lord individually and as a parish, growing stronger in our faith and in our Christian witness in the community. Please be prayerful about the way the Lord is leading you to be participating in the life and ministry of St. Peter's this year. You will find that in being involved and serving in the way He is leading you, your life will be truly blessed in the process.

Spiritual Adult Ed Programs

SOUND For Haiti

June Williams and her team, SOUND For Haiti, have been ministering in Haiti for four years. Through the World Vision Sponsorship Program in the Central Plateau, children are gathered from villages as far as the Dominican border to participate in the annual SOUND For Haiti music camp and concert. Despite illnesses this year, and a hurricane on the last day of camp, the sun shone through at the time of the concert, and thousands from the surrounding villages came out and enjoyed the healing power of community prayer and song.

For the second week, the team left the mountain region to visit the School of Music at Ste. Trinite Episcopal Church in Port-au-Prince. The school and church were destroyed during the earthquake and many lives were lost. SOUND visited members in 2011 to encourage them to let music fill their hearts again, and in July 2014, SOUND assisted the School of Music in teaching a summer camp and holding a concert in their newly rebuilt school and church.

One afternoon June visited the Maternity Hospital and met a new mother whose baby girl was in critical condition at three days old. June asked the mother's name and the baby's name, so she could pray with the mother, Maxine. Maxine said she couldn't name the baby, so June asked if she could name her Hope. By the end of the hour, through a series of miracles, surgery was scheduled for the baby at a local hospital, and Baby Hope began her journey to wellness. Isaiah 56:5 says "To them I will give ... a memorial and a name ... I will give them an everlasting name that will not be cut off."

On their way to the airport at 7am, the team was very tired, but they stopped at a church that serves 1,500 children in the surrounding area. The church had asked SOUND to sing, and when they went in they saw that two of "their" earthquake girls (from the ER Home – Earthquake Relief Home) were being baptized! The SOUND team got to represent their families. (All family members were killed in the earthquake and there are no records of the girl's births!)

Thank you, St. Peter's, for supporting the work of SOUND For Haiti as the team has opportunities to bless and be blessed through music and in coming alongside brothers and sisters in Haiti through presence and prayer.

One Sunday in the late summer we attended an 8am service. It immediately felt like we had come home and it didn't take long for us to fill out the application and join. These days we sometimes go to 8am worship, which is more contemplative, and sometimes to 10 am to participate in the music and enjoy fellowship during the coffee hour.

Mike and Julie moved to Connecticut from New York soon after they were married. They have three adult children: Dan is married to Megan and lives outside Philadelphia; Maureen recently married Jeff in Danbury and James lives at home. They also have two small dogs: Harry, who was named after Prince Harry, just wants to be the life of the party; Chance was found on the streets in Texas and at 3 weeks of age, rescued, and took a chance on a forever home in Connecticut.

Mike and Julie have degrees in Economics and English, respectively. Mike works as a banker. Julie is retired. She stayed home when her children were young, then worked for a few different non-profits, and ended up teaching English as a Second Language, and General Education Diploma courses to adults for a few years.

Path to Miracle: Goes Through Uncomfortable Territory

“Then the LORD spoke his word to Elijah, ‘Go to Zarephath in Sidon and live there. I have commanded a widow there to take care of you.’ So Elijah went to Zarephath.” (1 Kings 17:8-10a NCV)

When you’re scared to death and vulnerable, you don’t know where you’re going, you don’t know how long it’s going to take, and you don’t know what’s going to happen when you get there, what do you do?

You remember that the path to a miracle is always through uncomfortable territory.

The Bible gives an illustration in 1 Kings 17:8-10: *“Then the LORD spoke his word to Elijah, ‘Go to Zarephath in Sidon and live there. I have commanded a widow there to take care of you.’ So Elijah went to Zarephath”* (NCV).

God told Elijah to walk more than 100 miles during a drought through dangerous territory, where everyone knew who he was, and everyone knew King Ahab had a price on Elijah’s head. When Elijah finally made it to Zarephath, he met a poor widow who was going to feed him, but how could she help defend or protect him from a pagan town full of people who wouldn’t hesitate to kill him?

Miracles don’t happen when things are comfortable. Miracles happen when things are uncomfortable. Elijah didn’t say, “God, there are three things wrong with this plan. One, you’re sending me in the wrong direction. Two, you’re sending me to the wrong location. And three, you’re sending me to the wrong protection.”

Elijah just obeyed.

The path to a miracle is always through uncomfortable territory.

For instance —

- When Moses led the Israelites out of slavery to the Promised Land, they had to go through the Red Sea first.
- Before David could slay Goliath, he had to walk onto the battlefield.
- God told Jehoshaphat to put the choir before the army, and he’d win the victory. How much faith do you think that took?

Miracles never happen in your comfort zone, when everything’s great and convenient. You don’t need a miracle when everything is settled in your life. You only need a miracle when you’re on the edge, when you’re scared to death, when you’re insecure, when you can get hit at any angle.

Are you at a place right now in your life where things are a little uncomfortable — financially, emotionally, relationally, or physically? You’re a little nervous, a little on the edge, a little insecure. Congratulations. You’re on the path to a miracle!

Just like Elijah, God wants you to obey, so you can see his miracle at the end of the road.

Talk It Over

- What is God asking you to do that makes you uncomfortable?
- What do you want God to do in your life? How have you expressed your anticipation of his miracle in your life?

Who are the people who can encourage you on the uncomfortable road you may be walking right now?

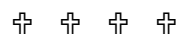
