Come Celebrate!



As Christians our lives are meant to be a celebration of who we are in Christ and what He has done for us. Phil. 4:4 says, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say Rejoice." Psalm 118:24 says, "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Jesus said, "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you, abide in my

love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my JOY may be in you, and that your JOY may be full." (John 15:9-11) The word, rejoice, occurs 194 times in the Bible and a total of 286 times in its different forms. We celebrate the Holy Eucharist, and the person leading the service is referred to as the Celebrant. We call a wedding service, "The Celebration and Blessing of a Marriage" as we are celebrating the union of husband and wife in their life in Christ. Even the funeral for a Christian is called a Celebration of the life of that person because we are celebrating the blessing they were to us in their life on earth and celebrating the knowledge that they share in the resurrection of Christ to eternal life with the Lord in heaven.

It was no coincidence that the first miracle of Jesus recorded in the Gospel of John is turning water into wine at a wedding celebration- and really good wine at that. We are called to celebrate life in life-affirming ways. Is it any wonder that birthdays are such important celebrations to children, to teenagers, and really to anyone who isn't at that stage of life where they wish they would slip by unaccounted for? They are important because it's a time we say to that person, "You are important to me! We celebrate the day you were born! Your birth was God's gift to us! How thankful we are for you!" It's a time we say "you matter to me" to that person we are celebrating.

Remember the words God the Father spoke over Jesus at his baptism, "You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:22) It's a basic human longing to have these words said of us by our parents and by our Heavenly Father. In our baptism, when our sins are washed away and we are reborn into this restored relationship with our Heavenly Father through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, it is as if those words that were spoken over Jesus are being spoken over us not only in our baptism but every day that we are living in Christ, "You are my beloved Child, in you I am well pleased." When we are in Christ the prophetic words that were spoken of Jesus in Isaiah 42.1 can be applied to us as well, "Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights!" And so we celebrate our life in Christ and we celebrate all the promises of God that have their Yes for us in Christ Jesus just as we will celebrate for all eternity someday in heaven. We also long to invite others into that celebration in Christ. This is why our banner out front says, "Come Celebrate!" It isn't just an invitation to join us in our anniversary celebration. It's an invitation to join us as we celebrate our life together in Christ.

Bible Study on Healing

This Bible study is for anyone interested in learning more about the healing of Jesus either for themselves or to be a part of the ministry of prayer for healing. Participation in this Bible study does not mean there is an expectation of participation in this ministry but those who would like to participate in the ministry of prayer for healing are strongly encouraged to participate in this study if they are able. This group meets Wednesdays 5:00-6:00pm and will be taught by Rev. Cynthia Knapp. It includes reading and discussing a scripture passage, guided meditation where we place ourselves in the story, and prayer.

Small Group Studies: We are encouraging parishioners to form small groups for prayer, study, and to encourage one another in our spiritual growth. These can be groups that share the leadership role, rotating that responsibility each week, or where one person takes the responsibility of leading. Having a relatively consistent meeting place is helpful to avoid confusion about where it is meeting each week. You are welcome to call the church to be placed in a group that is meeting at a time convenient for you or to work among yourselves to form a group. There are some already identified that people are welcome to join. We are suggesting you choose one of two possible tools to give your time structure and instruction for your study:

- 1. **A Spiritual Formation Workbook**: A Renovare Resource for Spiritual Renewal. This book provides eight sessions as well as a structure for continuing beyond those sessions if the group chooses to do so. It incorporates Bible reading and prayer as well as discussion and application to daily life and suggestions for thoughtful, prayerful work between meetings. It also teaches the development of a balanced vision of the Christian faith and practice demonstrating the need for all of the six major movements within the Church using the life of Jesus Christ as a demonstration of this balanced and whole approach to spirituality:
 - The Contemplative Tradition- Practicing the Prayer-Filled Life
 - The Holiness Tradition- Practicing the Virtuous Life
 - The Charismatic Tradition- Practicing the Spirit-Empowered Life
 - The Social Justice Tradition- Practicing the Compassionate Life
 - The Evangelical Tradition- Practicing the Word-Centered Life
 - The Incarnational Tradition- Practicing the Sacramental Life

For this study the recommended group size is anywhere from 2 to 7 people to allow for time for everyone to contribute in the discussion without going beyond the allotted time. Group members can purchase the workbooks individually or arrange for one person to pick them up for the group and be reimbursed by the members. The cost of the paperback workbook is about \$11.00 on either Amazon or Barnes and Noble.

2. **Crazy Love** by Francis Chan with the accompanying DVD set. This study presents us with the radical, unconditional, self-sacrificing love of God, encourages us take a look at our response to that love, and invites us into a relationship with the God of the universe who loves us with this crazy, all-powerful love. The book (and DVD) is broken down into 10 chapter/sessions to study and discuss with your group. The book and DVD set are available through Amazon or Barnes and Noble with the book costing about \$10 and the DVD set costing about \$28. The group would share the cost of the DVD set between the members. There is a group that meets 9:00 a.m. on Sundays in Cynthia's office.

The polishing removes most of the haze from the outside and allows the stained glass to be seen from the outside. The windows are particularly beautiful at night when the lights are on in the church. More importantly, during the day more light passes through the windows into the church. That, coupled with the new paint, has increased the light level in the church somewhat. Although this work does not bring the covers back to a brand new condition it allows us more time to raise funds to replace them with aluminum frames and glass covers.

St. Peter's has been informed that the service that hosts our website is discontinuing service as of December 31st. A new website host has been chosen and I have begun the process of moving from the old to the new. The new site will have a long awaited

Put God First in Your Finances Through Tithing

"Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33 NIV)

One of the best known and most successful business leaders of Southern California once told me, "Rick, you need to tell people the best time to start tithing is when they're in debt. That's when they need the most help."

Whatever you want God to bless in your life, you put him first in that area. You want God to bless your business? Put him first in your business. You want God to bless your marriage? Put him first in your marriage. You want God to bless your time? Put him first in your time. You want God to bless your finances? Put him first in your finances.

Whatever you put God first in, that's what he blesses. Matthew 6:33 says, "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (NIV). You have to decide that you're going to tithe and you're going to save, even if it means you live on less so you can do those two things.

You can live on any amount you have to. It is a choice. Nobody made you drive that kind of car, live in that kind of house, or pay those kinds of bills.

God wants you to give, and he wants you to save. If you tithe 10 percent and save 10 percent, that means you live on 80 percent of your income.

Let's say your family income is \$60,000 a year and you started this plan at age 40. Over the next twenty years, by age 60, you will have given \$120,000 to God's purposes in the world and you would still have more than \$120,000 set aside in your investments or your savings.

It may mean big changes for your family. It may mean you make sacrifices and give up some things. But it works! There are enormous payoffs. God will always honor the areas where you put him first.

The Bible says, "The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives" (Deuteronomy 14:23 LB).

- What are the items that you are most attached to? How might those things compete with God in your life?
- · What do you think saving money has to do with putting God first?
