Again and again throughout the entire testimony of scripture the Lord calls us to love one another. (1 John 3:11) We love because He first loved us. (1 John 4:19) The Lord is the author of love and the one who has made it possible to get past ourselves and love others with that unconditional, no strings attached kind of love that is rooted in God's love for us. Indeed his Spirit within us is the very source of that love. John 13:35

says, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another." Our love for others is the strongest witness we have. In fact if we speak of our faith but are unloving toward others, we will negate our witness! We learn to love from the author of love who died on the cross for our sins and rose in victory over sin and death in the resurrection. In Him we have life and have life abundant. What makes it so abundant? In the Lord our lives are filled with love. He teaches us to be more loving and fills us to overflowing with His love. We learn to love God and to love others as we walk with Him and as we study His Word

Lent (which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18th) is a time of repenting of those things that pull us away from living as the Lord calls us to live and a time of seeking to live in a way that better reflects His presence within. It is a journey toward a more holy life—a life filled to overflowing with the love of Christ. Our Lenten study this year is 40 Days of Love, a study by Rick Warren based on the book *The Relationship Principles of Jesus* by Tom Holladay. A number of years ago the people of St. Peter's did a parish wide Study using 40 Days of Purpose based on Rick Warren's book, *The Purpose Driven Life*. Everyone met in small groups in people's homes and were immensely blessed by the study. Because people were blessed individually the parish at large was blessed as well. Where the 40 Days of Purpose focuses on personal renewal, the study we are using this Lent focuses on relational renewal. Both are vitally important! Our love for one another is an expression of our love for God which comes from that personal renewal. Both are necessary.

Our world is crying out for relationship renewal. There are signs of broken relationships all around us and many of us bear scars from broken relationships of our own or in our families. This is an opportunity for healing and going forward into health and wholeness in our relationships as we learn to express our love for God in loving others. Then, truly, they will know we are Christians by our love.

Caring for your children

St. Peter's is pleased to care for your young children during the 10:00 a.m. service. Childcare is available for children through age 3. A trained special education/elementary education teacher, Amanda Sayers, and an assistant care giver, who has participated in Red Cross and Safe Church training, provide care for the children in the nursery on the second floor of the education building. An usher will be happy to assist you in locating this room. Our Church School program meets during the 10:00 a.m. service for children ages 3-12. They will be led to class by their teachers and returned in time for communion. Visitors are encouraged to have their children participate

Church School & Youth Ministry

Sunday school meets during the 10:00 a.m. service. Children start out worshipping with their families and then proceed to classes with the teachers. We have a wonderful team of teachers and a great group of kids and are looking forward to a terrific time together studying God's Word and applying it to our lives! The young class, preschool through first grade, will be hearing a Bible story each week and using wooden figures and props and a related activity or art project to help with the understanding of each story. The older class, second through fifth grade, will use Group's Bible-based curriculum, "Faith Weaver Now".

Spiritual Adult Ed Programs

Morning Bible Study continues to meet on Tuesday at 7:00 a.m. in the church library.

Women's Bible Study continues to meet on Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11:00 a.m. and is doing a Beth Moore study on 1 & 2 Thessalonians, called "Children of the Day". This Bible study will break during Lent and then resume.

True Spirituality- is part of the Living on the Edge series by Chip Ingram. This study meets on Wednesday evenings 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m, beginning with dinner. This powerful study removes the clutter and presents a clear, compelling, Biblical picture of a true disciple of Jesus. The teaching is a 25-minute video followed by an hour of discussion informed by scripture. True Spirituality will break during Lent and then resume.

Alpha classes are held Thursday evenings 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m., beginning with dinner. This 15 week course is designed to walk people through the basics of the faith in a way that works for those new to the faith and enriches the faith of those who have been going to church all their lives. Many parishioners have taken this course and found it transformational.

Lenten Study: 40 Days of Love: We are hoping the entire parish will participate in this study by Rick Warren based on the book *The Relationship Principles of Jesus*. Small groups are being formed and you are welcome to form your own. The leadership is provided by the study guide and the video that is shown for each session. Members can even alternate facilitating the discussion that follows. Please sign up at church or call the office or Cynthia Knapp to be placed in a group or for help forming your own. We are happy to help you obtain materials or they can be ordered online.

Only God Can Provide

"Since he did not spare even his own Son for us but gave him up for us all, won't he also surely give us everything else?" Romans 8:32 (TLB)

The major cause of stress in your life is worry. You worry because you wonder if you will have what you need when you need it. But anytime you expect other people to meet your needs instead of God, you're going to be frustrated and disappointed, because nobody can meet all your needs. Only God can meet all your needs.

If you want a cure for stress, you need to learn to look to God to meet your needs.

Some people find their security in their job, and when they lose their job, they lose their peace of mind.

Others put their security in their marriage. Then their spouse dies or they go through a divorce, and they ask, "Who am I? What is my identity?"

Or maybe you put your security in your money. There are a lot of ways to lose your money.

I recommend that you never put your security in anything that can be taken away from you. You can lose your job, your health, your reputation, your spouse, and your mind. But you cannot lose your relationship to Christ.

When you put your security in that promise, you can trust God to meet all your needs.

Romans 8:32 says, "Since he did not spare even his own Son for us but gave him up for us all, won't he also surely give us everything else?" (TLB)

If God loved you enough to send Jesus Christ to die on the cross, don't you think he loves you enough to take care of every other need in your life? Yes! Of course he does.

Every time you start to get stressed out, you need to pause and say, "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want" (Psalm 23:1 ESV).

God's going to provide. He's going to take care of you. Instead of stressing out, you need to look to him to meet all your needs.

Talk It Over

- How do you normally react when you have a major need in your life?
- What do you need in your life today? Do you trust God to provide for it?
- What kinds of things do you think God wants to give you? What do you think he wants you to do with those things?
