The View from the Rector's Desk for July 2011



July is when summer truly gets going. School is over. Graduations, parties, and the like are past. Retirement has begun in earnest for the chosen few! It is too early to start packing for college, too early to start thinking about clothes and supplies and the like.

We start July with a bang – literally as the shoreline and the skies are lit up with fireworks. We end heading into the dog days of August – still far away from any thought of turning leaves and frost.

Your Vestry does not get the summer off – for on Saturday, July 16, we have a 6-hour work session with our consultant, the Rev. Bevan Stanley. We began work in June on a mutual review of ministry. This is a time for the leadership team of the church to step back and consider how we are doing, both Rector and Vestry, looking at themselves and at others in leadership. We have not had a consultant-led review for years and, given the serious strategy work we have done on the Purpose Statement, we wanted to ‘pause and reflect’ before we pushed on.

The making of time to pause and reflect is extremely important in the spiritual life. Formally called the Examen – it is time taken most often at the close of the day – before we put ourselves into God’s hands. Reflect on how the day went – joys, sorrows, places where God seemed present or absent. Ask for forgiveness and give thanks. Remember in prayer those who are brought to mind. As a discipline, this prepares us for participation in the prayers and confession in the liturgy the following Sunday. I bring to mind much of this as I offer the week that has past to God and place before God where I have ‘missed the mark’ in my life.

To fail to pause and to reflect at all – to rush from waking to sleeping – or from Sunday to Sunday, event to event, year to year is very easily to find our awareness of God’s presence entering into great decline. Not only so, but as that awareness declines, so does our sense of being directed by God in this life – and we feel orphaned, on our own with only our own resources to save us.

Please take note that there is a section of this month’s epistle with listings of resources for prayer and reflection – rather than printing the feature “Fish Food.” Also in this month’s Epistle you will find an expanded version of the Purpose Statement. A dedicated group of people has taken many hours to bring God’s purpose for us to this level of clarity. Now we need your help. Please read this expanded version – pause – reflect on it – and tell us your response to it, your reaction to it, your sense of whether it embodies the call God is making on us in this time and place.

Now, how about you. Will you take some time to rest from the frenetic pace of life? To relax, to restore your soul? To pause and reflect on where you and God and church have been this past year – and where you sense God’s invitation in the coming year? I encourage you to do so.

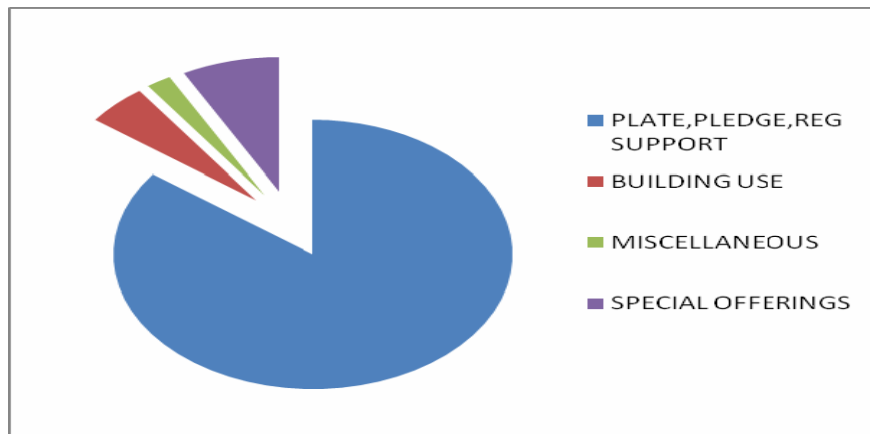

Youth Group Prayer Vigil

On Saturday, June 18, at 8:00 in the evening, the Youth Group of St. Peter's conducted a Prayer Vigil. The youth prayed for 12 hours using a technique that involved using both sides of the brain. While prayer continued to focus on Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication the participants used drawing and writing to maintain prayer focus. Using the suggestions from the book The Color of Prayer, participants created collages, doodles, and drawings to record their conversations with the Lord. After 12 hours, the tired youth emerged with an increased understanding of how they prefer to pray, and that prayer need not be filled with a variety of "these" and "thous" in order to be meaningful.

The Goings On At 71 River Street – Other Than Of a Religious Nature

There has been lots of activity regarding the buildings at St. Peter's. As a brief summary, we have had the HVAC Units in the Taft Wing Serviced. There are still some repairs that need to be done by the HVAC Company. The Property Committee met and did an inspection of all the roofs and are currently in the process of obtaining bids to replace the roof on the Taft Wing that has drainage issues and has had several leaks repaired over the past few months. The Clemence Memorial Hall also experienced a leak after one of the heavy rains which resulted in water in the administrative assistant's office.

A tractor-trailer truck got stuck in our lot on June 2nd in an attempt to turn around, as it could not get under the railroad underpass. This escapade resulted in damage to the two phone poles behind the Church, damage to the chain link fence, lawn damage and eight feet of wrought iron fencing by the parking lot being knocked over. Contact has been made with the trucking company and they will be paying us for damages.

There was a sink that was somehow knocked off the wall in the upstairs bathroom in the Taft wing. With the help of Paul Smith and Andrew, it was remounted and fixed shortly after it was reported (after a Sunday morning Service).

The Vestry, Property Committee, and Susan Persett met on June 11 to tour all the properties including the Rectory to familiarize everyone with what we own, and the need for attention and repairs. A few of us went up in the steeple all the way to the bell. This is quite a breathtaking experience. The steeple is in need of repair and we would like to seek possible government grants to help us.

Camping Out with the Bells
