The View for November 2011

At the Diocesan Convention this past week, Diocesan Bishop Ian Douglas centered his address on the theme of pruning – big cuts in budget and staff. One concrete response to our Diocesan financial challenges was to pass a resolution to force parishes to pay their 'fair share' (defined as 12.5%) of the cost of maintaining the Diocesan mission and ministry. This resolution creates a two tier

system of congregations in the Diocese. Those who pay at least 10% of their income gain certain benefits, those who don't face certain punishments – disenfranchisement.

In the local congregation, we don't have the ability to coerce gifts, so we try a variety of other approaches – often reverting to 'fundraising'. Often lost in the fundraising approach of today is the connection between what we do with what we have and what we believe. What would you discover in the way of evidence that one is a follower of Jesus Christ? This could be defined as:

- 1. I recognize that God is the owner of all that I have, that I am a trustee, not an owner, a servant or steward, and not a master or boss.
- 2. Across the landscape of my possessions from the cars I drive to the stuff I buy to the vacations I take there is clear evidence that I am making choices in small and large things to reflect how I value God's grace in my life, and my responsibility to give all I can in generous thanksgiving.
- 3. I live with an attitude that all of my money, and possessions, are at the disposal of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. All that I have I will give at the Lord's bidding.

Perhaps you haven't thought much about it. You respond to appeals for support from the church the same way you do the hundreds of other requests you get. The good news is how far a little effort will go in growing your life in God. Perhaps you have thought about it – and know what you should be doing – but live with the guilt and shame of knowingly compromising because you have mismanaged your finances, are so deeply in debt, or have such a limited income. We can help with planning! Just call us!

Perhaps you have taken God's call to heart – and are reordering your priorities – but are far from where you want to be. Don't give up; take the small steps that make up for a big change! Perhaps how you are managing your stuff bears the clear trademark that God is owner – you are steward. Well done! May you be blessed with the freedom and spiritual growth that brings! Tell us your story so we can encourage one another!

In November you can expect to be called and asked to welcome a visitor. This new approach to building community is intentional because we have a lot that has gone on and we want to think together and listen to one another as we prepare for the coming year. Please welcome the opportunity to visit with the folks that call.

Have you Met Sharon and Fred Callahan?

If you are an 8 o'clocker you have seen both of them frequently. Sharon is a lay reader and Eucharistic Minister. She has been a Sunday school teacher and a member of the Vestry. Fred is also an acolyte, a lay reader, a Eucharistic Minister, and he too was a Vestry member. They both serve on the cooking crews whenever there is a church breakfast. Both help with dinners for the homeless. You may also remember them in the role of officers in the St. Peter's production of "Arsenic and Old Lace".

Sharon is a native of Stratford, and Fred, a native of Havre de Grace, MD. They met while both were attending Bunnell High School and have been sweethearts since 1961. Sharon and Fred were married in Christ Church,



Stratford in 1967, and are proud parents of two daughters, Carrie and Megan, who are both nurses. They also have two very special grandsons, Matthew, age 9, and Christopher, age 7, both Carrie's sons.

Both Sharon and Fred are retired teachers. Sharon taught in Fort Dix, NJ, Fayetteville, NC, Bridgeport, Milford, and retired from the Trumbull School System.

Fred started teaching in Shelton, but had his career interrupted when he was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Viet Nam War. A supervisor neglected to process his deferment papers. After basic training, Fred went to Officer's Candidate School where he earned the rank of Second Lieutenant. Back home during this time, Sharon was busy making wedding plans. They were married and their honeymoon was a drive to Fort Bragg from Stratford.

While preparing to go to Viet Nam, Fred remembers seeing a long line of planes equipped with ramps, and troops driving their trucks up the ramps

and into the planes. His next stop was Viet Nam. Fred made several trips to DaNang to get supplies for the troops - a very dangerous job.

After a year in Viet Nam, Fred returned home to Sharon. He and Sharon spent a year at Fort Dix and was honorably discharged from the Army.

Fred had an interesting and unusual childhood. His father was an engineer for the Chrysler Corporation and worked for short periods in several different states and his family went with him. Fred fondly remembers his years at Fitzgerald High School in Warren, MI. Because his family chose to go to the church nearest their home, regardless of denomination, Fred was a Roman Catholic, baptized a Methodist, and confirmed as a Lutheran and was married in the Episcopal Church.

Fred returned to teaching as a physical education teacher in Milford. He taught at Calf Pen Meadow and Pumpkin Delight Schools. Later he returned to college, earned a Master's degree and became a math teacher at West Shore Middle School until he retired. Sharon went back to college while she was still teaching and earned both a Master's Degree and a Sixth Year Degree.

Now that they are retired, both enjoy reading, and Sharon jogs and walks as her form of exercise. Fred's hobby is collecting Disney memorabilia. He has fond memories of actually seeing Walt Disney at Disney Land.

The Callahan's came to St. Peter's from St. Andrew's Church in 1985. They felt that the people at St. Peter's were very friendly and welcoming.

We are fortunate to have such dedicated members of our church.
