The April 2012 View

This month contains the most important week of the Church Year. Holy Week and Easter. Beginning with Palm Sunday: the Sunday of the Passion, we learn of Jesus' final week on this earth in his human body. We pray in the Palm Sunday liturgy that we, "walking the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace."



Hard to comprehend, contrary to the world's way of thinking and behaving, and goes against what our human nature desires. St. John Chrysostom put it:

"I must not confess myself and my own being, nor cling to myself, but abandon myself in a radical renunciation of myself and not merely of my sins. I must no longer seek to establish my life of myself, but resolutely accept death and allow myself to be established by Christian Discipleship."

Here is the theme of Resurrection – of Easter – as we discover that the Cross and Calvary is an opening for life beyond our imagining. We enter that Easter life as we give ourselves over to following Jesus – the simple meaning of 'discipleship.' This year we have one additional service added to our Holy Week – an Easter Vigil on Saturday Evening, April 7th. Here we draw most fully on the entire span of salvation history – from creation to the Exodus to the gift of new life in Jesus through his Resurrection – becoming the light of the world which the darkness cannot overcome. Baptisms or renewal of Baptismal Vows may take place at this service.

I also want to give you a heads up for the first Sunday in May. The 6th will be the first visit of our new Diocesan Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Ian T. Douglas; to St. Peter's and at the service he will be confirming members of our parish who have been preparing for over a year. Confirmation, at one time a formal rite of passage, is now not so for members of the Episcopal Church. It is however, the Church's invitation to those whose baptism was the choice of another (usually a parent), to make those promises their own, declaring their commitment to the faith and asking for the power of the Holy Spirit to enable them in their life in Christ. The Bishop's visit will be a great day for this community and I ask you to commit to pray for the day and those being confirmed, and to plan to attend!

As we head towards these events and into spring and summer – changes that have taken place are going to create opportunities for your participation in helping not only on outreach projects, but here on our campus as well. As of writing we do not have plans to hire a new person for the office immediately, and as the winter (I know, what winter) goes away, we will be responsible for the grounds work ourselves since the parishioner who hired the company that did the work has left the parish. Diane Gendreau and the Property committee will be working on these things and letting you know how you can help!

Wishing you a splendid April and anticipating a fantastic Holy Week and Easter!

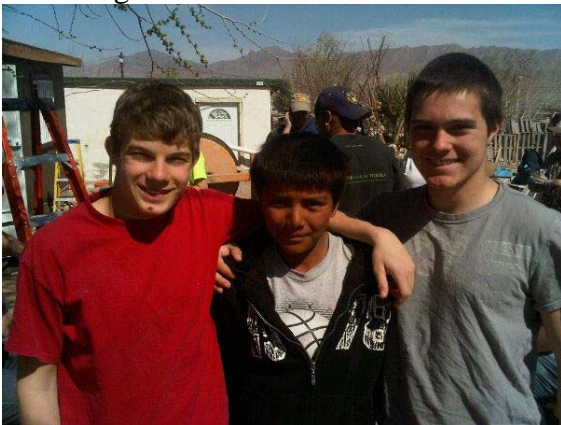

Personalize God's Word to Change Your Life

“And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns.” (Philippians 1:6 NLT)

God’s Word will never change your life until you let it become personal. It’s not about your neighbor, your friend, your spouse, or the stranger down the street. God’s Word must be applied to *your life*. The Bible won’t become dynamic until it becomes specific.

How do you make God’s Word personal? Try the **personalize-it method** of Bible meditation. Anybody can do it. You don’t need any special tools or advanced theological training.

You simply put your name in the place of pronouns or nouns in Scripture. For example, if I were personalizing John 3:16, I’d write something like this: *“For God so loved Rick, he gave his one and only Son so that Rick would not perish but have everlasting life.”*

Or, for Philippians 1:6: *“He who began a good work in Rick Warren will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.”*

Put your name in the text, and you’ll strengthen your faith and encourage yourself.

You can also re-write the verse as if God is talking directly to you. For example, Philippians 1:6 would be: *“I, who began a good work in you, Rick, will carry it on to completion.”*

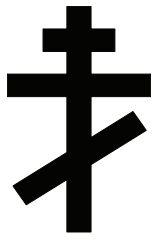
Do this, and many passages of Scripture will literally bring tears to your eyes. You’ll start to read the Bible as God’s love letter to you. It’ll be God’s gift to you! Reading your Bible isn’t just about getting to know the content of the Word; it’s about getting to know the author of the Word — personally!


