The vestry and I have just been on a wonderful retreat led by Lisa Irish, a grief counselor at St. Raphael's hospital, who walked us through the grieving



process to help us become aware of the needs of the people of St. Peter's. We learned that we all have different ways of coping with grief and heal at very different paces. We recognize that some of our members may be very much in need of further healing work, some from experiences connected to those who were very much a part of the St. Peter's family, while others are facing challenges from things that have happened in their own lives. There are many other parishioners and newcomers who are ready to be moving on to reorganization

and rebuilding. It is my hope to be responding in different ways both to the need for continued healing work (something I believe churches always need to be offering) and for the need to move forward in ministry to others, in spiritual growth, and in opportunities for fellowship and celebration together as the body of Christ. It is perfectly normal for many to be moving back and forth between these different needs so we will continue to provide different kinds of experiences for people with different kinds of needs.

We hope to be offering another healing service very soon and to provide an evening of contemplative prayer. We currently have a number of Bible Studies going on, having begun the Bible Study "Breaking Free" in December and a Bible Study on the Gospel of John in January. The Alpha program has also begun providing

an opportunity for people to work through questions of faith and to develop a stronger understanding of what scripture teaches. We welcome your thoughts and ideas about ministries or opportunities to further enhance the life of our

parish. There are many opportunities to be involved in ministry here at St. Peter's so please don't hesitate to speak with me or anyone else in leadership if you are looking to become more involved.

If that doesn't compute allow me to explain; as of last September I now live in Cologne, Germany. This Fall I made good on two major goals I've had for some time, namely, to spend an extended time living overseas and to earn a graduate degree in Early Music. The former should be pretty obvious. Regarding studying, I'm pursuing a Master's in Baroque Cello at the Folkwang University of the Arts in Essen. Balancing being a formal student with remaining active as an experimental musician takes some work but after a few months here I'm getting the hang of it. I have some upcoming performances in the worlds of music both old and new which I'm excited about and some more in the works. I realize most of you aren't in a position to come and listen but feel free to forward this message to your cronies in godless Europe who might be nearby and interested. It was hard to say goodbye to my friends and life in New Haven but this is in no way the end of those musical endeavors. To that end, keep your eyes peeled for albums on the way from Broadcloth and Dr. Caterwaul's Cadre of Clairvoyant Claptraps as well as a hopeful Broadcloth tour in the US in August. A big shout out to all my colleagues and students in CT and NY, especially my closest musical collaborators and friends these last three years: Anne Rhodes, Adam Matlock, Brian Slattery, Carl Testa, and Michael Paolucci. If you're wondering what I miss the most (besides, obviously, family and friends) it falls neatly into two categories: fiddle tunes and witty banter. I'm treating my old-time music needs by learning to play the fiddle and am trying to coerce as many Germans as possible into the ecstatic world of never ending Appalachian grooves. The banter will have to come later as I'm currently at a semi-vegetative level re: the Alpine force that is the German language. Stay in touch and stop on by if you find yourself near Cologne. We'll drink a Kölsch and consume a giant sausage.

God's Prescription for Good Health by Rick Warren

"Keep my commands in your heart, for they will prolong your life many years and bring you peace and prosperity." (Proverbs 3:1-2 NIV)

If I had a pill that promised to add years to your life, you'd probably pay a lot of money for it. But what if I told you that, as a Christian, you already have the key to a long life and that it's

God has given all of the principles for health management in his Word, the Bible. The Bible is the owner's manual for your body. As David says, "You made my body, Lord; now give me sense to heed your laws" (Psalm 119:73 LB). And in Deuteronomy, it says, "These instructions are not mere words — they are your life! By obeying them you will enjoy a long life in the land ..." (Deuteronomy 32:47 NLT). God says, "If you do what I tell you to do with your health, you will enjoy a long life."

Our key verse today says, "Keep my commands in your heart, for they will prolong your life" (Proverbs 3:1 NIV). What are some of those commands? "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil. This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones. Honor the LORD with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing ..." (Proverbs 3:5-10 NIV).

These verses highlight some factors that you probably don't think about but that will keep you healthy: tranquility, trust in God, integrity, humility, and generosity. These things will cause your health to be better, because your physical health is influenced by your spiritual health.

Over the next few days we'll look at some specific things the Bible says you should do for good health. For today, take some time to meditate on Proverbs 3:1-10 and ask God to show you ways you can grow in tranquility, trust, integrity, humility, and generosity.
