We are in the season of Pentecost- the season of the Holy Spirit and the celebration of the infilling of the Holy Spirit in our lives as believers. Summer is a wonderful time for walks on the beach and mini retreats where we spend prayerful time asking the Lord to strengthen us and fill us with that love and peace from having his Holy Spirit within. His Spirit within us helps us live out God's Word in our daily lives; to be walking demonstrations of God's Spirit within. However, only Jesus is perfect and there is nothing like a family vacation to put our patience and unconditional love

to the test. Just driving on the highway to get there, along with everyone else going on vacation, can short circuit our ability to remain centered on the Spirit of God if we don't guard ourselves carefully against it. Spending time in the Bible and in prayer, and being in fellowship with other Christians, helps to encourage and strengthen us in that practice of living out our faith in our day to day lives and having our character transformed into one that demonstrates Christ within. It is a practice or a daily exercise that needs to be done intentionally in order for it to become habitual and natural in our reactions to different circumstances. I have always loved the hymn that is a prayer for the Lord to do this in my life:

Take my life, and let it be consecrated Lord, to thee,

Take my moments and my days; let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my hands, and let them move at the impulse of thy love;

Take my heart, it is thine own; it shall be thy royal throne.

Take my voice, and let me sing always only, for my King;

Take my intellect, and use every power as thou shalt choose.

Take my will, and make it thine; it shall be no longer mine.

Take my-self, and I will be ever, only, all for thee.

The disciples were all together in one room worshipping and praying when the Holy Spirit came. We need the encouragement and fellowship of other believers to build one another in our faith. We have summer Sunday School and summer choir because we want to send the message that St. Peter's is not on vacation. Even though summer is a more relaxed pace and many of the midweek programs take the summer off, we still gather for worship, prayer, and fellowship every Sunday and Wednesday and are still very active in ministry.

Last Sunday afternoon at the Milford 375th parade, we had a float and a group marching wearing St. Peter's t-shirts that included the youth group and was spear-headed by Brendan Casey. It was a wonderful opportunity to be a visible presence in the community and all those involved had a great time together. St. Peter's is a place that serves those in need in the community, but it is also a place that builds up those who are members. We seek to bless our members through Christian education for all ages, helping people to grow in their faith, through coming together for worship and fellowship, and through opportunities to develop the ministries that the Lord has called us to. We are stronger together than we are apart and every member of the parish is needed for us to function in the full expression of Christ's body. It is our hope and our intention for people to find that their lives are better for being a part of this parish community. So, keep worship and the life of the church in your summer routine, and see if it doesn't improve the rest of your summer and make you better equipped to make the most of those family vacations.

God: Never in a Hurry; Always On Time

“Don’t try to get out of anything prematurely. Let it do its work so you become mature and well-developed.” (James 1:4b MSG)

Be patient with God and with yourself. One of life’s frustrations is that God’s timetable is rarely the same as ours. We are often in a hurry when God isn’t. You may feel frustrated with the seemingly slow progress you’re making in life.

Remember that God is never in a hurry, but he is always on time. He will use your entire lifetime to prepare you for your role in eternity.

The Bible is filled with examples of how God uses a long process to develop character, especially in leaders. He took 80 years to prepare Moses, including 40 in the wilderness. For 14,600 days Moses kept waiting and wondering, “Is it time yet?” But God kept saying, “Not yet.”

Contrary to popular book titles, there are no “Easy Steps to Maturity” or “Secrets of Instant Sainthood.” When God wants to make a giant oak, he takes a hundred years, but when he wants to make a mushroom, he does it overnight.

Great souls are grown through struggles and storms and seasons of suffering. Be patient with the process. James advised, “Don’t try to get out of anything prematurely. Let it do its work so you become mature and well-developed” (James 1:4b MSG).

Don’t get discouraged. When Habakkuk became depressed because he didn’t think God was acting quickly enough, God had this to say: “These things I plan won’t happen right away. Slowly, steadily, surely, the time approaches when the vision will be fulfilled. If it seems slow, do not despair, for these things will surely come to pass. Just be patient! They will not be overdue a single day!” (Habakkuk 2:3 LB)

A delay is not a denial from God!

Remember how far you’ve come, not just how far you have to go. You are not where you want to be, but neither are you where you used to be. Years ago people wore a popular button with the letters PBPGINFWMY. It stood for “Please Be Patient, God Is Not Finished With Me Yet.” God isn’t finished with you, either, so keep on moving forward. Even the snail reached the ark by persevering!

Talk It Over

- How is God using a season of struggle in your life to develop your character?
- Why is it so hard for us to be patient, even when we believe God is at work?
- What promises from God or experiences from your past can you remember that encourage you as you wait on God’s timing?
