On the first Sunday of November we will be celebrating All Saints Day. This is the day when we remember those believers who have gone on to heaven before us and now form part of that great cloud of witnesses who are cheering us on as we run the race for Jesus that Paul speaks about in Hebrews 12:1-2. They are rooting for us as we follow the way that Jesus has set before us to live for the Lord, loving him and serving him and growing into the person he has

created us to be that more fully reflects his image. Those saints (remember a saint is a believer in Christ as he is the one who makes us righteous before God) are in a place where they now know the Lord fully and have that perfect understanding that comes from being fully in his presence, so they now know the importance of living in and for Him. (See 1 Corinthians 13:9-12)

We just had a wonderful celebration of our 250th anniversary where we experienced the richness of the blessings of being part of a family of faith that was formed 250 years ago by a group of believers who committed to live as the body of Christ that would become St. Peter's Church. We are spiritually standing on the shoulders of those who have gone before us here in this place and who have impacted our faith in our lives. We have a responsibility as Christians to those who would come after us to invest our time and energy in our spiritual growth as individuals and as a parish and to be faithful in bearing witness to that faith both in our words and in our deeds. We do this through studying scripture, through prayer, through worshiping the Lord together, through telling others about our faith, and through living out that witness in the many ministries of service that we participate in. For this parish as a whole to be strong each member must be strong in their individual commitment to live for the Lord. When we do this together, we strengthen and encourage one another and combine our efforts that are then multiplied exponentially through the Holy Spirit at work in this place. But it all begins with an individual commitment to live for the Lord. This is how we ground our lives and this place on the bedrock that is Jesus. That is the rock that Jesus is saying he will build his church on (Matthew 16:18). It is living out the faith that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. This is what that great cloud of witnesses is shouting to us as they cheer us on from heaven. They know because they are living in the light of his presence and are encouraging us to do the same. This is how our shoulders are given the strength to encourage and prepare those who come after us who will be the witness of the future. We cannot pass on what we don't know and experience ourselves and we have an accountability that extends far beyond our own lives. This gift of faith and of demonstrating what it is to walk with the Lord is the greatest gift we can give to those who will come after us. It is because of what Jesus has done in our lives and in the church that we have such cause to celebrate!

Caring for your children

St. Peter's is pleased to care for your young children during the 10:00 a.m. service. Childcare is available for children through age 3. A trained special education/elementary education teacher and an assistant care giver, who has participated in Red Cross and Safe Church training, provide care for the children in the nursery on the second floor of the education building. An usher will be happy to assist you in locating this room. Our Church School program meets during the 10:00 a.m. service for children ages 3-12. They will be led to class by their teachers and returned in time for communion. Visitors are encouraged to have their children participate.

Church School & Youth Ministry

Sunday school meets during the 10:00 a.m. service. Children start out worshipping with their families and then proceed to classes with the teachers. The Episcopal Society became St. George's Church and, in 1851, became St. Peter's Church with dedication of the current church building.

What Does a Daily Quiet Time Look Like?

“The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance, but everyone who is hasty comes only to poverty.” (Proverbs 21:5 ESV)

Having a quiet time is like many other activities you might do in life — in at least one respect. To be successful, it helps to have a plan. The Bible says, *“The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance, but everyone who is hasty comes only to poverty”* (Proverbs 21:5 ESV).

If you’ve never had a quiet time before, you may not have a good, simple plan for doing one. Simplicity is important with any plan you develop. If you make it complicated, you’re more likely to get off track. All you really need for an effective quiet time is a Bible, notebook, and maybe a hymnal or songbook.

So what does a daily quiet time look like?

First, be quiet before the Lord. The Bible calls it waiting on God. You start by simply sitting down and shutting up.

Second, pray briefly. Start off with a short opening prayer. Ask God to open your mind and guide you. Ask him to cleanse your mind.

Read a portion of Scripture slowly. This is where your conversation with God begins. He starts speaking to you through his Word, and then you speak back to him through prayer. Read the Bible slowly. Don’t try to read too quickly or too much. The more slowly you read Scripture, the more you’re forced to think about what you’re reading.

Meditate on the Word. Spend some time chewing on what God is saying. Chew on the Word like cows chew on cud. Ponder and wrestle with it in your mind. There are lots of great methods for meditating on the Word. You can find specific ideas on how to meditate on the Bible in my book, *“Rick Warren’s Bible Study Methods.”*

Write down what you discover. When God speaks to you through his Word, care enough about what he is saying to write it down. Writing enables us to remember what God has said to us and record our discoveries.

Pray again. Be quiet. Ask God to show you his Word. Talk to God about what he has said to you. Tell him what you’re thinking about what he is saying. Talk to him about anything else that’s on your mind.

There’s not just one way to have a quiet time, but following a plan similar to this can get you started on a rewarding devotional journey.

Talk It Over

Have you ever thought about your quiet time as an intimate conversation with God? Why or why not?

What distractions do you need to eliminate in order to “be quiet”?

Why is it sometimes hard for you to read the Bible slowly and meditate on what it says?

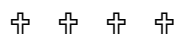
