Dear Friends in Christ,

As we come to end of the summer and head into the fall, I simply wanted to share with you one of my favorite passages of Scripture as well as a fairly new song that has a wonderful text. They reflect both my prayer for St. Peter's (borrowing Paul's prayer for the church at Ephesus 2,000 years ago) and my conviction that indeed "there is a hope" for all of us, especially in difficult circumstances. I trust both the prayer and the lyrics will be a continuing blessing to each and all of you.

"For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen." (Eph. 3:14-21)

As many of you already know, or heard for the first time this last Sunday, I will be leaving Connecticut after September 9. I am moving to Cologne, Germany to begin a graduate program in Baroque cello. For many years I've hoped to spend some time living overseas before I turned 30 and with that milestone fast approaching and this opportunity to study it seems the right time to embark on this new path. To put fully into words how much St. Peter's and my experience here has meant to me would take many pages and would still be incomplete. You took a chance on choosing a music director with a non-traditional background somewhat and laughable keyboard skills in the hope of finding your way in the often confusing landscape of music in the church. I don't know who learned more in these three years, me or the parish, but it has been a beautiful experience to see so many parish members step out with their talents and to hear you, as a congregation, join together in joyous song. Beyond just music, however, you have become my family of faith as well as close friends. I have felt immense love and support from the entire parish and hope you feel those things returned to you from me. I understand the timing of my exit is not great with the general upheaval surrounding St. Peter's but I want to be sure you know that this is a goal I had set for myself long ago and any connection to events here is purely coincidental. I stand with the St. Peter's community and will continue to do so even from across the ocean. From my perspective, we worked hard these three years to understand church music in an invested and participatory way. If I can offer you any admonition or encouragement as I go it is simply this; that you continue to sing together being mindful of the content of the words you sing and the spirit of the music. Like Brian Wren has said, "music is praying twice."

To Fulfill Your Destiny, Use Your Gifts by Rick Warren

"Each of us, as a good manager of God's different gifts, must use for the good of others the special gift he has received from God." (1 Peter 4:10 TEV)

Do you know what God created you for? Do you know what your destiny is?

The first thing you must do to understand your destiny is to recognize the gifts God has given you to use. They include the things you can't control: your parents, your nationality, your race, your first language. They also include your S.H.A.P.E.: your spiritual gifts, heart, abilities, personality, and experiences. These are the things that make you uniquely you.

Now, you are not responsible for the gifts God didn't give you. In other words, if you are not artistically gifted, you are not expected to paint pictures like Rembrandt. But you are responsible for the ones he did give you.

When you get to Heaven, God isn't going to compare you with anyone else, but he will compare you with yourself. What did you do with what you were given? What could you have done if you had trusted God a little bit more? Romans 14:12 says, "Each of us will give an account of ourselves to God" (NIV).

God has given you gifts for a purpose. And you have a responsibility to be a good steward of those gifts — not for selfish uses, but for the good of others. Your gifts are not for your benefit. God gave you gifts for the benefit of other people. Ask yourself, "What has God given me for good to use for good?"

Talk About It

If you haven't already, take the time to learn your S.H.A.P.E. — your spiritual gifts, heart, abilities, personality, and experiences.
